Dear friends, ladies and gentlemen,

All of you attending together with thousands of friends from Europe, America and Australia have participated in accomplishing the Association's mission – *child victims of war – our permanent care*. It implied children whose parents were killed during the war, disabled children, talented children, Romani national minority children and those with social needs.

When I greet you as friends, FRIEND, written in capital letters, I thank you, because without you the Association would be unimaginable.

A genuine and honest friendship is something best that can happen in one's life and for us it is happening for a quarter-century. We are aware what it means to us.

You are our best friends – those from the day we determined for the mission on 28 July 1994, those from the beginning of 2000 and those since two or three months. An old friend is the best, most valuable and most loyal friend. We have a saying – once a friend, forever a friend.

Nicole Richie (a TV presenter and actress) wrote: *"True friends are like diamonds – bright, beautiful, valuable, and always in style."*

And, because of that, once again and more louder – you are welcomed dear friends, so that together we can mark a quarter-century of philanthropy's triumph.

The term philanthropy implies humanitarianism – a philanthropist is a person who loves humans.

Twenty-five years ago, during midday hours, at the theater *Kamerni teatar 55* accompanied by a music curtain made by grenade explosions, 56 philanthropist gathered (the names are in the Monography).

I do not believe that anybody attending thought that the established Foundation would survive more than five or six years taking into account the conditions in which it was formed – everyday shelling of Sarajevo, innocent victims in the streets, houses, marketplaces, public places, often without electricity, gas or food. Moreover, as a symbol of resistance towards despair we committed ourselves to pen and paper, to alphabet and university education. We learnt Nelson Mandela's (South African politician and president) message in those years: *"Education is the most powerful weapon which you can use to change the world."*

Dear friends, philanthropists, I will present to you the most important activities and results accomplished in a quarter-century of activity and existence of our and your Association:

1. Scholarships

Since the first scholarships were allocated in the school year 1996/1997 – 38, through those in school year 2012/2013 – 609, to today's 315 in school year 2018/2019. 7.052 persons were allocated scholarships worth 6.358.535 KM or 3.251.067,32 in the European currency. The scholarship beneficiaries are those from the territory of Bosnia and Herzegovina and who fulfilled the requirements of the vacancies that are opened in June of current school year for the next school year. The scholarship focus was on child victims of war (75% of available funds), disabled children (10%), talented children (10%) and those with social needs (5%). In the category of child victims of war there are 25% of those receiving a scholarship from elementary school, through high school and university studies. Today many of them are persons with a family, employed in government institutions, economic organizations and the private sector. Unfortunately, a large number of them are in a search for a job for four or five years and are forced to search for it outside Bosnia and Herzegovina. An interesting fact is that the structure of scholarship holders - 53% are female and 47% are male.

Since school year 2005/2006, the Open Society Fund Bosnia and Herzegovina through the Association provides scholarships for children of the Romani national minority through the project "To the future with education". In the previous 14 years, 772 of children from the Romani community from 52 neighborhoods and towns received 1.630.600 KM. Besides the Open Society Fund providing scholarships for this population was also helped by CCFD (The Catholic Committee against hunger and for development France), Emmaus (Grenoble, France), Wolf Theiss and around ten other donors. This provided education for a significant number of children from the Romani minority. Unfortunately for us, every year there is a larger number of children (30-40) fulfilling the requirements of the vacancy, but that cannot become scholarship holders because of lack of funds. The relation of scholarships in terms of gender is close to 50% of girls and 50% of boys. This fact makes us happy.

Although with modest material resources, we showed empathy towards talented persons in Bosnia and Herzegovina. We published over twenty books of poetry by our scholarship holders. For a short period, the best tennis player in Bosnia and Herzegovina Damir Džumhur, judoka Larisa Cerić and the youngest chess

grandmaster Denis Kadrić had received scholarships. We regularly congratulate them for their excellent results – so that they are aware that we are happy because of their success.

For ten years (2000-2010), The City of Sarajevo through the Association provided yearly scholarships firstly for 40 scholarship holders and in the later years, for 80 scholarship holders. This was a significant support of child victims of war and the Association organized educational workshops with them and travelled around Bosnia and Herzegovina and Europe.

The biggest donors that supported the scholarship project were: Open Society Fund Bosnia and Herzegovina, organization CCFD (The Catholic Committee against hunger and for development - France), memberships, La Benevolencija-Fund "Tanja Mihać", Association of citizens "Unija veterana JOB DF PIO MIO", Cercle du Rhin International (France), Diplomatic Winter Bazaar, Megamix d.o.o., Bašić Rasema-Association Duga (Switzerland) and individual donations from Borovina Nihad, Jakupović Gordana and Ferid, Muharemović Ajlin, Pašić Nađa and Hajrudin, Rešidović Edina, Keega doo, Jakić Kemal, Tunović Adi, Selak Adnan, Biagiarelli Roberta, Šarić Taib, Čenanović Amra, Hanjalić-Beck Aida, BIHAMK UG, Filipović Svjetlan, Klaus Liroy Rocco, Mašić Edina, Mameledžija Selma, Hadžiahmetović Amir, Muminagić Suada, Halilović Haris, Hanjalić Kemal and Suada, Spahović Fatima, Mutevelić Nedžad, Pašalić Jasmina, Borovina Hajra, Bajramović Elmedin, Petrović Semin, Grafičar promet d.o.o., Kapidžić Emir, family Kopčić, family Koluder, Fund „Pavao Urban“, Fund „Kemal Hasibović“, Association „Nova nada“ (Norway) etc.

2. The educational – recreational – touristic project justifies the Association's

mission and objectives. It implies a summer vacation/camping at the Boračko Lake (80 km away from Sarajevo) and trips to countries in Europe and outside Europe for winter vacations (Klappen, Sweden), summer vacations, international conferences and peace activities. Beside visits to 18 European countries, we went also to Canada and Uruguay. Most of them traveled by plane or ship for the first time, flew over the Atlantic, visited the seaside, reached to the Eifel Tower, the Sagrada Familia in Barcelona, visited the Nobel Museum and the Atomium in Brussels. They had the chance to expand and acquire new knowledge in history, culture, art, cuisine... All of this happened thanks to you attending here, dear friends and our friends in Scandinavia, Belgium, Italy, and Catalonia. The most important thing of this project is the inclusion project at the Boračko Lake that we implement with the Boy Scout troops from Konjic. At the same place, over one hundred of them – child war victims, disable children, children from the Romani national minority, children with special needs from Drina, Fojnica, "Oaza" from Sarajevo, children from Republic of Srpska – Bosniak and Serb children together with scouts from Belgium and young people from France. One needs to experience the atmosphere of friendship, respect, tolerance and love.

4.359 Association members participated in the project and the amount of invested funds is 1.164.739 KM (595.521,59 EUR). For many years, material support for the summer vacation at the Boračko Lake we have from: Centar Municipality, Airport Sarajevo, HO Sproffondo, Argeta d.o.o., Hoše komerc d.o.o., Akova d.o.o., Perutnina ptuj d.o.o., Avaksa d.o.o., Azel France, Norfish Blagaj, Meggle Bihać, Podravka, Konjic Municipality, Emmaus Grenoble from France and the Canton of Sarajevo.

3. Project "Overcoming the posttraumatic consequences through

psychosocial rehabilitation, recreation and education for children, youth and parents/ guardians" is with its objective and activity content the most important one for parents and children. The reason is that through psychosocial workshops, journeys through picturesque Bosnia and Herzegovina and visits to cultural landmarks, historically important places of the year-long existence of statehood of nations from Bosnia and Herzegovina, is helping the rehabilitation of persons that experienced the horrors of the war. Three groups of women from Sarajevo (for around ten years), Visoko (for six years) and Hadžići (it will soon be a year), in seventeen years of the project's existence, became mentally and spiritually more stable and fully adaptable into the society. This is a great pleasure for us and for our donor CCFD (The Catholic Committee against hunger and for development from Paris). Mrs. Julie Biro is the most deserving for the project's beginning since 2002 and that it will last in future years. The project was also supported, from this year, by the City of Girona from Catalonia. The funds invested in this project, and that is 825.877 KM (422.264,20 EUR), justified its purpose. From depressed persons, mothers and children, we got persons with a positive view on life. What occurred is rehabilitation and their inclusion into an active life. Persons deserving most acknowledgments for this success are Edina Mahmutović, psychologist and psychotherapist, longtime project manager - Sanja Pačo (today Delija), and then after her Mersiha Turudija and for the last two years Melina Dželović. Imagine how a statement made by a woman sounds to us, a woman who is a war victim and who visited a theatre for the first time in 25 years, and after the play she states: *"Thank you, I smiled for the first time after my husband's death!"* The realization of this project was for more than 850 members who cruised through the Federation

of Bosnia and Herzegovina and further - Bihać, Jajce, Maglaj, Srebrenik, Dubrovnik, Stolac, Gradačac, Gračanica, Mostar! Thanks to the Girona Region (Catalonia) and together with CCFD we will implement one of the most humane projects in further years.

4. In the last quarter-century, the Association did not use budget funds from the local or federal governments despite the fact that, on several occasions, we submitted a request to the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina to proclaim the Association a charitable non-governmental organization since we fulfill all the conditions.

With the objective to secure persistent funds for scholarships, the Association prints and sells a yearly calendar and with that secures from 30 to 50 scholarships (30.000 – 50.000 KM). A large number of economic subjects, ministries, private sector and individuals participate in providing scholarships for the Association's members by buying the calendars. In around 20 years, over 400.000 calendars were printed and sold. This sale created funds of around 2.400.000 KM, which were used for providing scholarships for 2.400 children. An important fact is that scholarships holders are obligated to participate in the sale of 50 calendars and the goal is to partially participate in self-funding and acquire experience with the contact with buyers.

I am using this occasion to thank everybody that bought the calendars and with that gesture made the education easier for a large number of young people and children.

Among the most regular "buyers" of the calendar (individuals, economic entities and governmental institutions) we will mention: Almy doo, BH Telecom, Apoteka Delfin, Bičakčić doo, Tvornica Cementa Kakanj, Federal Ministry for Veterans and Disabled Soldiers Affairs, Zenko doo Zenica, Euroasfalt doo, BIHAMK UG, Chamber of Economy of the Federation of BiH, Faculty of Civil Engineering Sarajevo, Unifarm doo, City of Zenica, Energoinvest dd, Farmavita, Berlin-Chemie AG, Zira doo, Federal Department for Inspection Affairs, Federal Pension and Disability Insurance Institute Mostar, Roche doo, Embassy of the Republic of Italy in BiH, Regional Cooperation Council, Mikrokreditna fondacija Sunrise Sarajevo, Elektroprivreda BiH, Central bank of BiH, Grafičar promet etc.

5. A large number of "smaller" projects were the opportunity for children and Association's members to be in a contact with both local and wider social communities. Projects like: "Youth for Youth", "Bonton komunikacije", "Caring for the elderly", "Sarajevo, spread your wings", "Fresco for peace", "Voices of Citizens of Europe 2014 – 2018", International Peace Campus, Peace Camps (Barcelona, Uruguay), "Raspberry plantation Girona", participating in cleaning after the floods in 2014, various workshops during camping at the Boračko Lake developed the feeling of need in children and young people to be useful in the society where they live and educate themselves. There are not asking themselves what the country did for them, but what they did for the country and the community. We are not satisfied with the number of Association member that accepted and realized the importance of volunteer work for personal affirmation and respect within a local community and wider.

6. With a partnership with Mebius film and the project manager, Mrs. Duda Sokolović, the Association supports the educational project „Perspective“, that deals with the conditions and problems in the educational process in Bosnia and Herzegovina and neighboring countries. The educational process, with its content and schoolbooks (history, geography, and language) cultivates aversion among children and youth towards differences instead of developing love towards differences, tolerance and the paths of reconciliation. We feel proud that we are a pebble in this project that was excellently accepted in the region.

7. When mentioning the moto of the 25th Anniversary of the Association – a quarter-century of philanthropy's triumph – I imply many individuals, international organizations and towns. With the Belgian organization "Ecoliers du Monde" we cooperate for more than 15 years and with our friend Jordi Rodri and his organization "Trenkalos" from Barcelona for more than 20 years. There is a continuous cooperation with ARCI, "Nema problema", „Cercle du Rhin International“ from Strasbourg and my school friend from the military school in Paris, Colonel Cardone Gerard. The town of Choisy le Roi gives us a wind in the back for the last three or four years. The government of the Girona Region supported us in the realization of the project "Raspberry plantation Girona" and now supports the project of psychosocial rehabilitation. Our fellow-citizens on "temporary" work in Chicago, Oslo, Goteborg, Stockholm, Switzerland continually support the mission – *child war victims* and other Association members. During last years, the Italian artist Roberta Biagiarelli with her friends aims to incorporate in her projects the story of the Association and especially Srebrenica and the genocide on Bosniaks. For around ten years, dozens of children and youth from Italy and

several European countries had visited the Association where we talk to them about its establishment and activities, which we are so proud of. The heritage of Pavao Jusuf Urban- Ibruljević enabled a five-year scholarship program for, firstly, child war victims, but also talented children with the average grade over 8,50. World famous fashion designer Agnes B, as well as Sanela Jenkins were the Association's donors.

Unforgettable are the trips from the project "Baton of peace and friendship" on three occasion to the Auschwitz concentration camp with around 250 children from Italy, Slovenia, Croatia, Slovakia and Czechia, organized by a humanitarian – lawyer from Piacenza Bortolo Brogliatto. Also, the visit to Lugano of 30 children during a ten-day summer vacation. Mestres per Bosnia from Barcelona accepted in their families 20 children who are war victims. French choir "La Viva" from Clermont-Ferrand two times hosted choirs from Bosnia and Herzegovina, Serbia and Croatia. Unforgettable are the cooperation with Emmaus Sassenage from Grenoble and project "Peace Camp" of the Foundation Forum universales de les Cultures from Barcelona that hosted Association members in Barcelona and Montevideo. All of these events are embroidered in the idea of humanitarianism, philanthropy.

A constant material and moral support came from the City of Barcelona thanks to the engagement of Mr. Manela Vila, a friend of Sarajevo and Bosnia and Herzegovina, who was declared an honorary citizen of Sarajevo because of his unmeasurable contribution in humanitarian aid during the war and reconstruction of Sarajevo after the war. With delight, I am mentioning the long-term cooperation with the FAMA project and an honest friend of the Association, Suada Kapić, the author of the project „Mapping the wars in Yugoslavia and defense of Sarajevo“. Her attempts to make a Museum of the Defense of Sarajevo in the Hastahana Park are not successful. Unsuccessful is also the Association's idea to make a beautiful Monument for Women of Sarajevo who protected Sarajevo.

We are grateful to everybody who contributed in securing that the Association members could have a certain financial stability during their regular education.

A notable contribution to the stability of the Association and its mission and objective were given by our "fans": Alajbegović Senada, Bajramović Elmedin, Bikić Halid, Borovina Hajra, Borovina Nihad, Halilović Haris, Hanjalić Kemal and Suada, Hodžić Fikret, Jakić Kemal, Jazvin Zlata, Denijel, Rijad, Imran, Rukaja, Kapidžić Emir, Koluder Amela, Amra, Bahrija, Ibrahim, Mameledžija Selma, Mašić Edina, Muminagić Suada, Mutevelić Nedžad, Pašalić Jasmina, Petrović Semin, family Kopčić, Rešidović Edina, Spahović Fatima, Tunović Adi, Uzunović Nedim, Čabaravdić Mirsad, Arslanagić Amira and Seno, Arslanagić Nicole and Semir, Bašić Rasema, Biagiarelli Roberta, Čenanović Amra, Filipović Svjetlan, Hadžiahmetović Amir, Hanjalić-Beck Aida, Jakupović Gordana and Ferid, Karahmet Aida, Kišija Enes, Kremo Haris, Liyo Rocco, Mehanović Edin, Mehanović Elizabeth, Muharemović Ajlin, Paciucci Gianluca, Pašić Nađa-Hajrudin, Prohić Nerma and Malik, Rustemov Zejna and Vildan, Selak Adnan, Asim Alikadić, Nadira Šabanović, Džemal Najetović.

We should not forget a group of musicians from Sarajevo who allowed the usage of their songs on a cassette, which the Association sold to secure funds for scholarships. Painters from Sarajevo donated their pictures for an auction from which scholarships were funded for the Association's members. Damir Šagolj, a photographer of international reputation and a member of a Pulitzer winning team, offered 15 photos on an auction and public persons from Sarajevo purchased them. In that way, 12 scholarships were secured. La Benevolencija donated hygiene items couple of times.

All of this could be incorporated in the moto of the 25th Anniversary- a quarter-century of philanthropy triumph.

This also refers to the Association "World Photographers" from Girona, whose founder Miquel Ruiz organized two notable exhibitions in last four years – "Srebrenica" and "Oslobođenje during war".

During this holiday of joy, love and peace, we point out the sister and brother, Mirela and Laka. From their heart and soul, they composed and recorded the song "Postoje ljudi" which is played on radio stations these days. In addition, we point out tonight's concert of Amira Medunjanin in Sarajevo City Hall which is, as it is said, "the cherry on the cake".

Thank you dear friends.

The crucial role in the functioning of the Association and its existence and stability for a quarter of a century had the members of the Management and Supervisory Boards. In the last ten years members of these boards were: Redžad Čatić, the President of the Management Board, Mehmed Agić, the Vice President, Ibrahim Koluder, member; Elmedin Bajramović, member; Esmā Brković, member; Fejsal Hrustanović, member; Sanja Delija, member; Veljko Droca (deceased member), Sead Spahović, President of the Supervisory Board; Smail Vilić, member; Sead Miljković, member; Madžira Pavlović (Assembly President, deceased), Almin Škrijelj, current Assembly President.

It would be a pleasure for us to award them with the pictures of the renown Bosnian painter Safet Zec. We do not forget good deeds.

8. Memberships and donations to the Association

Not a minor item in the material funds used for providing scholarships for the youth and children derive from yearly memberships and donations. Association members are individuals and collectives from the country and from abroad that are united by the idea of strengthening the philanthropy in Bosnia and Herzegovina and in efforts to help Association's user groups in various ways, with their own material contribution and volunteer work, in achieving educational and other socially useful needs.

By the way, the number of members in the 25 years of existence of the Association is 11.705 and the allocated funds are 401.000 KM.

The largest individual donations were made by the company Wolf Theiss from Austria and IMG – investment group of the UNHCR, Pavao Jusuf Ibruljević, SCC, Mirsada Čabaravdića, Agnes B, Šarić Taib, Jazvin Zlata, Rijad, Imran, Rukaja, family Koluder, David Ayres, Cercle du Rhin, La Benevolencija-FUNd Tanje Mihać, Halid Bikić, Enens Bečirbašić and Tarik Kurbegović.

In these cases, we at the Association were in disbelief. We were pleasantly surprised when these philanthropists mention the amount of the donation. Our gratitude is minor compared to their humane gesture, but the pride that a citizen or citizens have the trust in the mission and to people who with trustfulness and enthusiasm execute it. These examples should motivate us that through memberships in the Association and donations, we can make the education easier for children and young people, but also enable educational and touristic trips in Bosnia and Herzegovina and abroad.

9. Informing the public

Printed and digital media represent the consciousness and conscience of the Association regarding the fact that they report the public, in a highly objective manner and in continuity, about the community service activities of this non-governmental organization. The media's support motivates the operational staff and Association members, because their presence in these media is their affirmation and a positive experience in communication with the public. Huge breakdowns happen when some of the scholarship holders needs to stand in front of the camera for the first time or give his statement to a journalist for the first time. However, the results are, thus, really positive, from stuttering in front of the camera to a mature answer to journalist's question. It is interesting that there were reportages about the Association in newspapers and TV stations from Catalonia, Italy, Belgium and France. I will mention domestic media, as a sign of gratitude for recognizing and supporting the Association's mission and objectives and those are: Oslobođenje, Dnevni Avaz, Nezavisne novine and Start; portals Klix.ba, source.ba, Romani portal Udar, TV stations: BHT, TV1, TV N1, FTV, TVSA, FaceTV, NTV Hayat, TV Alfa, Radio Federacije BiH, Radio Sarajevo, Radio 8, Radio M, ASK radio, Kalman Radio, Radio BIR and news agency FENA. A large number of articles in printed and digital media are a confirmation of the transparency in Association's activities and a motivation for Association's donors to continue with the support for children and youth and for them to establish their present and future in Bosnia and Herzegovina.

We are exceedingly grateful to all the media. Without them it would be hard to accomplish our mission.

The Association's Monography 1994 – 2019 is a gem that had been cut out for a quarter of a century. In the Monography, all activities were mentioned chronologically from the establishment in 1994 to May 2019 and when data entry was completed it contained all activities performed by the Association, with statistical data about scholarships, summer and winter vacations, workshops, Association's functioning, lists of names of children and youth that received scholarships from year to year and all donors all mentioned – domestic and foreign, as well as those who gave funds 25 years ago to the last one who made a donation of 5.000 KM in February 2019. Photos witness the trips, summer and winter holidays and international meetings where Association members participated. We have a lot to brag about, because good people, humanitarians and child-lovers were generous. With hundreds of letters of thanks that the Association received in a quarter of a century the most precious one is the sixth April Award of Sarajevo for 2016.

10. When a person loves what he does in his life, there are no obstacles that he cannot overcome. That is the case with the Association's operational staff: Edin Bećarević, Executive Director Deputy who is also one of the Association founders; Mersiha Turudija, the Project Manager, who made it from a scholarship holder to an employee since 1 March 2009; Melina Dželović, also made it from a scholarship holder to an employee from 1 September 2017. All of them with enthusiasm and self-sacrifice successfully carry out tasks that derive from the Association's mission and objectives set a quarter of century ago. In this team, Mehmed Agić equally participates. He is a contractor from 5 May 2000. Selver Geko, with more or less success managed the Association's finances, so there were no nonsense in this highly sensitive area. We form a micro family – from a morning coffee together and agreements on that day's tasks, monthly activity analysis, celebrating birthdays, celebrating family members successes, we do not forget the meritorious members that are not with us any more, we become godparents to each other, attend the weddings of scholarship holders or exams at the university. We offer Association members to accept from us what is good and useful for them and to reject what is not acceptable in our activities. We treat the Association's property as the one in our homes.

Team spirit, mutual respect, tolerance, helping each other and harmony helps in overcoming even unpredictable problems and for the Association to function, with minor oscillations, for 25 years. We invite Association members to talk about it and not the operational staff. I congratulate them publicly. In the last years, a nucleus of the group of volunteers was formed and they give a significant contribution in the success of Association's activities. We will mention their names as a sign of gratitude and a motivation for them personally and for those who do not understand the importance of volunteer work for a social affirmation. The most active of them are: Aida Hasović, Adisa Dvoženić, Selma Zahirović, Emir Šarić, Haris Hebibović, Dalila Ahmetović, Ohran Rakita, Adi Ramović, Avdo Džino, Armin Bilal, Ajna Hasanbegović, Sedina Huremović, Seida Nuhanović, Haris Osmanović, Nejra Kukić, Samra Delić, Sabina Brkić, Bekir Ibrahimović.

11. Conclusion

Dear friends, philanthropists, children and humanitarians, the existence of the Association and significant results in activities in the community was achieved thanks to you above anything. Three individuals employed at the Association with the average income of 1.000 KM and state taxation of 65% invested a huge effort in these highly difficult socio-political and economic conditions, to secure that 58.260 children, young people and their parents/ guardians receive material funds in the amount of 6.100.000 EUR. Already from Monday (24 June) with the same enthusiasm we will continue the preparations for the summer vacation at the Boračko Lake, announce the vacancy for scholarships in school year 2019/2020, select the theme for the wall calendar for 2020, work on project that will make funds for the Association's activity. In one word, marking the quarter-century of the Association is the continuation of the realization of the Association's mission and objectives established on 28 July 1994.
